DIRECTIONS

The Audre D. Carlin Reading Room and John Wolfson Rare Book Room are found in the Weston Foyer:

Carlin Reading Room and John Wolfson Rare Book Room. Please note you will need to ring the doorbell to gain access to these rooms.

OVERVIEW

The Globe's Library contains:

- Texts and criticism of plays by Shakespeare and his contemporaries.
- A selection of 16th and 17th century poetry.
- Periodicals including Shakespeare Survey, Shakespeare Bulletin & Shakespeare Quarterly.

The Globe's Archive contains:

- Records dating from the late 1960s which chart the gradual development of the Globe project from dream to reality.
- Production materials for plays performed at the Globe since 1996, including programmes, prompt books, show reports and archive videos.
- Administrative records, press-cuttings, copies of in-house publications and material relating to the Globe's educational activities (including recordings of staged readings, talks and discussions).
